The Code on Wages, 2019 ostensibly seeks to harmonise four different laws governing the payment of wages and minimum wages in India, and "simplify and rationalise" the law. However, it is a missed opportunity to update the definition of "employee" in the context of the rise of the "gig economy," a source of livelihood for a large number of workers who do not enjoy formal protection under the labour laws.

ABSTRACT

This paper attempts to develop a few measures or scales of entrepreneurial motives of women, given the socio-cultural factors in developing economies. Within the push-pull theory of entrepreneurial motivation, we use exploratory factor analysis with an orthogonal varimax rotation technique to examine entrepreneurial motivation, integrating it with socio-cultural beliefs. We identify five entrepreneurial motives—self-dependence, preserving handloom culture, providing monetary support, formal job environment, and work-flexibility. Within socially constructed gender roles, generic desires of women are crucial for entrepreneurial behavior.

ABSTRACT

Jharkhand is one of the most vulnerable and poverty-stricken states of India. There are limited programs and campaigns for communities that include gender and sexuality as prioritized public health concerns of adolescents and youth. This article uses experiences from work done specifically on gender and sexual reproductive health and rights (SRHR) in grassroots of Jharkhand with adolescents and youth over a period of three years. The first part of the article discusses a technology-based health initiative on gender, sex and sexuality in some villages of Jharkhand.

 <u>Gender-Based Wage Discrimination in Indian Urban</u> <u>Labour Market : An Assessment, By – Balakarushna</u> <u>Padhi, Udaya S.Mishra & Urmi Pattanayak</u>

ABSTRACT

This study attempts at verifying the pattern of the wage gap between gender in India's urban labour market using NSS 50th (1993–1994), 61st (2004–2005), and 68th (2011–2012) Employment and Unemployment Surveys. The wage gap between sexes in the urban labour market is verified among the regular and casual workers over a period of two decades (1993–1994 to 2011–2012). Using Blinder–Oaxaca decomposition as well as Recentered Influence Function (RIF) quintile decomposition analysis, it is observed that there is a male bias in wages in both the categories, namely, regular and casual workers. Female workers are also at a disadvantaged position via-a-vis male counterparts, and there is considerable disparity exists with regards to employment and earning standard between sexes.

 Paid-Unpaid Work Continuum of Women : Home-Based Workers and Self-Employed Women in the National Capital Region, By – Sudeshna Sengupta

ABSTRACT

Women's work is a continuum that intersperses productive work with reproductive work, unpaid work with paid work and all kinds of activities with leisure and self-care. She plans, manages and implements her work at home, often being responsible for all the three domains. Women from working-class families may seem to be making a "choice" in deciding the continuum, and delving deep, we find that it is more often a "coping mechanism" in "managing poverty" of all forms—income, time and opportunity.

ABSTRACT

Labour force participation rate in the Indian agricultural sector is gradually declining. This paper wants to investigate the possible causes behind it. Here both possible push and pool factors behind this decline are considered simultaneously. Initially, on the basis of 70th round NSSO data on agricultural households, it is tested whether or not marginal farmers are enjoying comparative advantage during the time of getting employment in the agricultural sector as agricultural labourer. But as 'decline' is a flow concept, to investigate possible reasons behind this decline, we have considered six rounds state-level NSSO data on Employment Unemployment Survey of India and its 20 major states.
