INTROSPECTION

The hour of departure has arrived. Times move and change. Who could have imagined three years ago when we took the challenge of mobilizing domestic workers, that we shall be able to embrace hundreds of them so close to our hearts. Very soon we realized first we have to move people's heart. When people change, history changes, without fail. The door to a new age will not open as long as we wait for it to open. We must open it ourselves, through our own dauntless courage and action. The heterogeneous nature of metro city Delhi where too often diversity becomes a cause of conflict, where people tend to distinguish between us and them, the domestic workers learned the important concept of "We" and stood up eagerly to become a union. The doors of opportunities and victories begin to open for them.

Holistic approach from health care to rights awareness and advocacy has been the integral part of the community based action programmes undertaken by ISST, Saathi centre under the umbrella of SDTT funded domestic workers' mobilization programme. As the programme advanced towards its third phase and after taking inputs from Kolkata workshop, we added the components of collectivization and unionization to our advocacy part. Now the meetings were focused more on organizing the domestic workers, understanding and addressing the issues and problems faced by them at their workplaces and society at large from the platform of their own organized actions.

BACKGROUND OF THE PROJECT

Kalyan puri and surrounding areas (slums and resettlement colonies), in East Delhi, where ISST's Community Outreach Programme (COP) is being run, in an area with very high incidence of crime and drug abuse, besides other problems faced by any urban slum locality. Women here are mostly engaged in domestic work, generally seen as an option for those who do not have any specific training or are classified as 'unskilled'. Men are informal sector workers in occupations such as auto drivers, factory workers, fruits and vegetables vendors, petty retailers or domestic help. The houses in the area distinctly look like cramped up box type structures standing one on top of the other, with steep staircase, no ventilation or sunlight housing 8 members on average, with each couple having at least three children which can go up to even seven or eight. For children and youth in these households, there are limited opportunities for anything beyond very minimal care or education, and plenty of risks posed by the surroundings. These include drug dealers and drug abuse, frequent outbreaks of violence, and fear of sexual violence for girls. While many children are enrolled in school, there is also high dropout and some non-enrollment. In many cases especially where women go out to work, it has been found that many girls either never enroll in school or drop out after 5th standard in order to take over child care responsibilities for younger sibling and household chores as both their parents have to work to make ends meet.

ISST's study on urban poor livelihoods (2008-9) supported by SDTT includes a major study of women domestic workers in Delhi. A key finding of the study in East Delhi was that of the whole sample of married domestic workers who have children at home, nearly 52% leave them on their own when out for work. Based on the interviews conducted during the domestic worker's study, it came out clearly that women were concerned about the environment in which their children will grow up, as articulated by them that in many areas alcohol abuse and drug abuse is fairly common and as children are left unattended, they are susceptible to many such negative influences. To quote from the study. 'In the absence of any facilities for child care, proximity to work and reliance on social network becomes even more significant. Sazid, a domestic worker from Gokulpuri made a clear link between wages and childcare. She said "the number of households women are able to work in is dependent on the age of their children, the lesser the responsibility at home, the more they are able to take." Such views were echoed by several other women interviewed. Rani who had four children (age 8, 10, 15 and 17 years) said she would only work in one house in Gokulpuri and earn Rs. 600, as opposed to working in more houses as she wanted to be near her children – two of whom were recovering from substance abuse.' Moreover, with many children out of school (45-50 percent of girls under 15 years, depending on the area, were not in school) it was noted that young girls get drawn into domestic work (26% of the sample of girls children in East Delhi and 43 percent of the sample in North East Delhi).

MAIN OBJECTIVE:-

1. Mobilizing women domestic worker to enhance their quality of life through various interventions.
2. Setting up child care and youth resource centre and link the children of D.W to these programme to support them through crucial years of their development.
3. To provide appropriate and adequate training to the staff to ensure effective intervention on daily basis and also to enrich ISST'S resource bank.
4. Empowering domestic workers through formal SHG's and pressure groups to take charge of their own life.

SUB OBJECTIVES:-

1. Mainstreaming of domestic workers & their families.
2. Providing information regarding government facilities.
3. Legal awareness and assistance.
4. Awareness regarding health nutrition and cleanliness.
5. Listening to their problems/grievances and exploring solutions.
6. Formation of pressure groups and self help groups.
7. Running a Right to Information help desk.
8. Establishing linkages thorough networking with ISST, GRC and other government and non-government initiatives.
9. Skill development of domestic workers and their young daughters in the same area or other areas of their interest.
10. Encouragement and enrollment of their dropout daughters and sons in open schooling system.

Domestic workers of the area have always been discussing the problem of leaving behind their younger kids when they are out to work. They either leave their kids at the mercy of their neighbours or lock them up in the house. Sometimes the the elder sibling specially daughter has to be there to look after the younger ones.

Following points discussed during the meeting:-

1. How many hours they spend on work outside home.
2. What arrangements they make for their younger as well as older children.
3. Are they satisfied with these arrangements.
4. Can we think of opening a crèche by pooling out some resources.
5. For a crèche we need to have a facilitator.
6. For facilitator every domestic worker will have to contribute some amount.
7. In the end women agreed that they can think about contributing for running a crèche for their younger children.

Resource person briefed them about how unions of different marginalised workers have created a difference in their lives. Without organised efforts, achieving concrete goals is impossible. Domestic workers have no union like a labor union in Delhi, so they need to organise and make their own trade union.

Details: -

As discussed in other domestic workers' meetings, the need for a place where small children can spend their time was reiterated. Mothers of small children repeatedly expressed their worries about leaving their small children in non conducive environment. The government Balwadis present in the area reported to be

almost non functional. They don't have any support except distributing some meals. Apart from this the problem of getting different certificates from authorities was also a major point of discussion among the group.

The following points were covered during the meeting:-

1. What kind of facility is required for small children.
2. How far they go to work
3. Who looks-after their children when they go to work?
4. Can we create a facility with joint efforts.
5. Are we ready to contribute some amount for the facility.

In the end women agreed to contribute for crèche. The meeting concluded with little refreshment distributed among the participants.

Around 1000 domestic workers across the city were also present in the rally. Community mobilizers briefed the group about the issues and demands raised by activist groups.

The resource person has told the participants about SHG. The purpose of SHG is to save money to help your own needs. Resource person discussed the following points:-

1. There should be 10-20 members in a SHG group.
2. All members should save same money.
3. Members of SHG can take loan from group's saving account.
4. They can return loan in installments with a very little interest.
5. Members of the group have to maintain some rules to run the activities of group in proper way.etc.

The resource person first took the feedback of the training classes which they had been taking two months ago.

After that resource person discussed about the meaning and need of unionization. Resource person told the participants about the work of union in Rajasthan and Maharashtra. In Rajasthan domestic workers are getting many benefits after unionization. They are getting four leaves in a months and also Deepawali bonus. It is important organize and form a union to get the benefits. After that resource person discussed about the Jaipur visit to be held from 9th December-2013.

Resource person told to participants that there are many types of violence we face in our day to day life like: - Gender based violence, physical and mental violence, economic violence, violence at work place etc. A woman suffering from domestic violence can file a case under domestic violence act 2005 and court will provide a free lawyer to the victim. Resource person then answered a number of queries raised by the women.

The meeting with domestic workers was held at 19-20, Block Kalyanpuri from 2:00 to 4.00 pm. The agenda of the meeting was accessing Govt. Scheme.

Community mobilizers informed them that govt. runs many schemes for the poor people but they are hardly aware or well informed about most of them. There are 42 schemes run by Govt. like:-Ladli, old age pension, widow pension, JSY, SJSRY, help for the marriage of widows' daughters, subsidy on petrol to handicapped, scholarship for school children under SC/ST/OBC, handicapped pension, admission in public schools under EWS quota etc. Mobilizers told them about these schemes in detail.

They were also informed that if they have any administrative problem with any govt. department they can file an RTI application to know about the progress of their work/application.

Saathi Centre organized a domestic worker's meeting at 2, block, Trilokpuri, Delhi-91, from 2:30 to 4:30pm. There were 45 women present in the meeting. The object of the meeting was to give information about R.T.I. (reproductive organ transmitted infection).

Infection that accrues due to unhygienic conditions of reproductive organs like: lacuna, itching, bad smell, external wound. These unhygienic conditions of reproductive organs lead to painful menstruation, painful scanty, irregular menstruation etc. later these unhygienic conditions create problems in conceiving and cause repeated abortions.

We should clean our internal organs carefully. One should use sanitary napkin during menstruation and should change napkin after six hours regularly.

We can take some precautions in our food habits. All of these problems are easily curable by taking precautions and with the proper guidance of doctors.

4. Paid annual leave and sick leave.
5. Four paid leaves in a month.
6. Protection against sexual harassment at the place of work

Attendees :- **45**

Resource person told the participants about the concept of mahila panchayat, why it is important to sort out domestic and neighborhood matters with mahila panchayats and how can we form a mahila panchayat. Women discussed about various matters where things went out of proportion due to the mishandling of police or other govt. agency. The women were divided into groups and role plays were performed taking different issues like dispute with in laws, neighborhood dispute, marital problem etc. After the role play it became quite clear that problems need to be explored first rather than addressed immediately. A patient listening is very important. The following understanding was developed after the role play and discussion.

1. A body of women needed that understands the community and family relationships
2. The body may be trained in legal, networking and other related issues.
3. The body may be elected by members of organized group.
4. The body may take up issues related to family problems, marital disputes and neighborhood issues.
5. Mahila panchayat must be abide by the law of land.

The women decided to form mahila panchayat. To begin with 20 members were given the responsibility of looking after the matters of mahila panchayat. Resource person told the participants the basics of mahila panchayat. She also advised them to keep records of all the cases. Some of the important points she advised to remember are following.

1. A patient listening should be given to all the parties concerned.
2. Try to be non judgmental.
3. Explore the problem and possible solutions.
4. Discuss the case among panchayat members.
5. Do not encourage any illegal reaction.
6. Fix a date, time and venue for each case.
7. Keep a list of referral agencies.

Domestic Worker's Rally

A National rally on domestic workers demands was organized by the "Delhi Gharelu Kaamgaar sangathan" on 31st july to provide a national platform to domestic workers. Aroud thousand domestic workers were assembled at Jantar mantar from different areas of India including Delhi to raise their voice for their rights and demands in front of the Govt. of India. 11 domestic workers and two staff members of Saathi centre attended the programme.

Three Days' learning and training visit to Jaipur

9th December-2013 to 12th December-2013

As it was decided in Kolkata workshop which was held in m/o March-2013, ISST was keen to organize a learning visit of some domestic workers jaipur in month of December-2013 for domestic workers to show them the work of unionization of domestic workers in jaipur under MKSK. Rajasthan Mahila kaamgaar union, as it is known is registered under the trade union act.



Total Member - 35

10th December is celebrated as “International Human Rights Day”. ISST planned a meeting of its domestic workers with Rajasthan Mahila Kaamgaar union at Raja Park in Jaipur from 11:00am to 4:00pm. Rajasthan Mahila Kaamgaar union has 21 groups in Jaipur and around 5,000 women are attached with this union. They assembled at Raja Park in Jaipur to celebrate Human Rights Day under parasol- shadow of resource

person Meva Bharti who was leading the programme. Resource person welcomed all the participants especially ISST team. Resource person discussed about Human Rights Day. After that she told about the work of domestic workers union in Jaipur. The resource person said about their movement regarding union and its activities like:

1. What is the difference between organisation and trade union?
2. How can we form a union?
3. Who can become the members of a trade union?
4. How will the union work?
5. When they will assemble (fix date)?
6. How can they press for their demands?

Resource person told that not only domestic workers, fruit seller women, vegetable seller women are also the member of union. They all gather area wise at one place every month on fix date and conduct their meetings. Resource person said that because they have no project these days so union decided that every member donate Rs. 30/- to run the activities of union. This was appreciable. The participants who went from ISST were encouraged to make their union. The meeting was finished with tea arranged by ISST. All were happy to share their experiences at work.

11th December

There were two meetings held on day two. One meeting was held at Mayapuri in Jaipur and other was held at Durgapua in Jaipur. Both meetings were related day 1st meeting. All members introduced with each other and shared their worked experience. Women from ISST, asked some questions regarding union from Rajasthan Mahila Kaamgaar Union's members, they answered all question skillfully. Rajasthan Mahila Kaamgaar Union's members shared their experience about union. They told that why did they join the union and which type of benefits they got after join the union. Resource person (Meva Bharti) told that recently Rajasthan Govt. passed an Act about minimum wages for domestic workers. It was fixed Rs. 4800/- per month. In 2008 the first union had been registered in labor department. The Rajasthan kaamgaar union issues an I-card to their members.

Note: The domestic workers from ISST learnt more like: how will they work to create and register a union? Domestic workers decided that they will fix a date for their meeting after returning to Delhi.

12th December-2013

The day was reserved for local visit of Jaipur. Domestic workers from ISST, visited different local area of Jaipur like: Ganesha and Birla Temple, Amer and Jaigarh fort, Kanak Vatika, Jawahar Circle and local market (Bapu Bazar). Women enjoyed the day and purchased famous things of Rajasthan.

OZ HAAT VISIT

Total participants :- **50**

Australia High Commission organized an OZ HAAT Fair for the NGOs and their beneficiaries on 7th December-2013 from 11:00am to 6:00pm at Australia High Commission's lawns, Shanti Path, Teen Murti Delhi. ISST received an invitation from Australian High Commission to participate.

ISST staff members, some domestic workers and their children went to attend the OZ HAAT for exposure. The aim of this exposure was to show the different income generating activities and stalls of different NGOs, so that women can take some ideas from them. ISST also put one stall of games for the children in OZ HAAT and conducted many other activities like: poster and slogan competition, children's street play, G.K competition, songs.

Domestic Violence Day (23rd November-2013)

ISST, Saathi Centre planned to celebrate "Woman Violence Day" for the domestic workers. At Saathi Centre, a full day workshop was organised on "Domestic Violence" on 23rd November-2013 from 10:00 am to 4:30 pm. ISST invited the organizations that are working with domestic workers in Delhi along with some domestic workers of that area.

Total Participants :- **83**

The participating organisations were Jagori, Chetnalya and Shehri Mahila Kaamgaar Union. The aim to organize this workshop was to acknowledge the daily life threatening problems faced by them apart from facing the evils outside.

The meeting was conducted by the resource person from Jagori. Resource person discussed questions like What is gender? Activities and role plays were performed to understand the gender biases rampant in our society in the name of honour.

Resource person played a game with participants named “agree and disagree”. She asked some questions to the participants to which whether they were agree or disagree. The game was very interesting. The aim of this activity was to develop the understanding of what is Violence.

After this exercise the discussion continued as most of the participants didn’t know the right meaning of domestic violence.

Resource person told a short story “Chauth Abba” to participants. Story helped them to understand the power of a man against woman.

After the discussion another resource person who was a domestic worker shared her experience of violence which she faced in her domestic life. She even sang some songs based on her experiences as a victim of domestic violence.

After lunch, session started with a play “HALLA Bol” presented by the Nakshatra group of ISST. The play was based on the Nirbhaya gang rape case. All participants appreciated the play. It inspired the woman to prepare their own theatre group. After theatre performance the session was handed over to next resource person who was a lawyer in high court. The resource person discussed the following points during his session:-

1. Domestic violence Act.
2. Crime against women and remedies available.
3. Criminal cases and their implications.
4. Legal procedure.

Participants asked many questions to resource person regarding domestic violence Act.

The session was made participatory and discussion enriched environment.

FOUR WEEKS TRAINING PROGRAMME FOR DOMESTIC WORKERS

Date :- **16-9-2013**

Venue :- **13-14, block BVK, Kalyanpuri**

A four weeks training for domestic workers on various fields of their profession was organized. Today’s topic was care of old person and child at home. ISST called a resource person for the training. Resource person asked some questions to domestic workers:

1. How do they take care of an old person at home where they work?
2. How do they clean an old and sick person?
3. Which type of meal is essential for an old person and a child?
4. How do they look after of a child?
5. How do they clean a child?

The resource person then described in detail how to perform these duties efficiently.

Venue :- **13-14, block BVK, Kalyanpuri**
Topic :- **Personal hygiene**

While working at someone's house what kind of personal hygiene they maintain?

Resource person told them that it is essential for every domestic worker to keep and maintain personal hygiene.

1. We should take bath daily in the morning before going to work.
2. We should use apron, mask and gloves during work and also at the time of caring old and sick person & child.
3. When we take precautions (use apron, mask and gloves) we are likely to avoid diseases and keep ourselves clean.
4. After finishing work and cleaning sick and old person and child we must wash our hands
5. We should wear clean and tidy cloths.
6. Our mouth should not smell.
7. We should maintain ourselves as a job going man/woman maintains himself/herself

Date :- **18-9-2013**
Venue :- **ISST, Saathi centre**

Material used :- **BP apparatus, stethoscope, thermometer, gloves etc.**
Topic :- **Para medical (uses of BP apparatus, thermometer, weigh machine etc.)**

ISST organized four weeks training for domestic workers. Today's topic was Para medical (uses of BP apparatus, stethoscope, thermometer etc.) Resource person asked to participants that

1. How to measure body temperature with the help of thermometer and BP of human being.
2. What is the normal temperature of human body?
3. What is the normal BP?
4. When should take the patient to the doctor?
5. Why and when should we keep wet and cold strip on forehead?

Resource person showed a thermometer to the participants and told them how to measure temperature and invited all participants one by one to show thermometer for practicing.

After that resource person showed BP apparatus and stethoscope to the participants and discussed about BP. First resource person showed how to measure BP with the help of BP apparatus and stethoscope and called participants one by one for practicing how to measure BP.

Date :- **19-9-2013**
Venue :- **ISST, Saathi centre**
Topic :- **Para-medical (uses of normal medicines)**
Material used :- **Medicine like:-PCM, cough syrup, betadine, dettol, crape bandage, etc.**

Resource person gave general information about medicines like:

How should we keep and take medicines in different normal diseases like: - PCM for fever and light pain, Dicyclomine in stomach pain, PCM and Citrazine, Amoxy etc. In cough and cold, different antacids, UTI related medicines with their doses and called each and every one to see the medicines. Apart of that resource person gave information about the take care of patient. The resource person asked the participants that how should we change and keep bed sheet of the patient and which type of food should be given to the patient. We should be careful about the cleanliness around the patient. The room of the patient should be airy and should wash our hands before and after meeting with the patient. We should wash patient's relative things like:-clothes, towel, bed sheets, etc. with antiseptic and warm water. After that the resource person called each participant to practice the above.

Topic :- **Water sanitation.**

Broadly there were seven components of sanitation discussed during the training:

1. Safe drinking water practices

2. Safe disposal of human excreta
3. Safe garbage disposal
4. Safe hand washing practices, spitting in open, urination at public places
5. Personal health and hygiene
6. Safe disposal of animal excreta
7. Safe waste water management

Material used :- **Posters, apron, gloves, mask etc.**

Following points were discussed.

1. Why there is a need of a kitchen?
2. Why the hygiene of kitchen is important?
3. How can we keep a kitchen clean?
4. We should always keep our kitchen dry.
5. We should use anti-insect treatment time to time in kitchen.
6. We should use apron, gloves, mask during work.
7. Open all windows and door of kitchen during work so that the fresh air can enter in kitchen and bad smell can exit.
8. Water disposal and drainage system should be proper.
9. We should try to use exhaust fan.
10. Use of dustbin.
11. All eatable items should be kept covered.

Topic :- **Healthy food items.**
Material used :- **Pumpkin, Sugar, ghee, peanuts, chidwa, spices, vegetables, chatni material etc.**

The subject was how can we make healthy food items for children with normally available things and why it is essential.

Resource person made halwa of pumpkin and poha. All participants took interest and helped in the process and practiced. Resource person told the benefits of this halwa and poha and the nutrition values which they contain for the health of children and other members of family.

Topic :- **Healthy food items.**
Material useds :- **Til, radish, spices, maida, paneer, onion, vegetables refined oil, etc.**

Resource person showed how to make til and radish chatni and healthy momos made of grain flour and soybean. All participants took interest and helped in the process and practiced. Resource person told the benefits of til chatni, healthy momos and the nutritional values which they contain.

Topic :- **Uses of oven and making bakery items.**
Material used :- **Oven, cake material (milk, sugar, coco powder, vanilla essence etc.), upma material(suji, vegetable, kari leaf, sarson dana etc.)**

Resource person showed that how can we make a healthy cake using electric oven, how much time a cake takes to cook? How we start an oven and which kind of safety/ precautions we should take when we work on electric items like oven. After that resource person showed how to make upma? She also told them about presentation etiquettes. All participants took interest and helped in the process and practiced.

Thereafter resource person told the values of upma and healthy cake.

Use of oven and making bakery items with the help of oven. Resource person showed the participants that how to make suji idli and pizza in oven. These all items have in demands these days. Resource person told the participants that we should keep some things in our mind when we use Oven like:

1. We should not use wet hands and cloth while using oven.
2. We should not use wet cloth to clean the oven.
3. We should use power plug for oven.
4. We should keep oven on a plain surface etc.

Material used :- **oven, cake material (milk, sugar, coco powder, vanilla essence etc.), upma material(suji, vegetable, kari leaf, sarson dana etc.), til, radish, spices, maida, paneer, onion, vegetables refine oil, etc., kaddu(pumpkin), Sugar, ghee, pea nuts, chidwa, spices, vegetables, chatni material etc.**

In the presence of resource person domestic workers made different items. Resource person divided the participants in seven groups and gave one item to each group to prepare like: - idli to one group, pizza to another group etc.

Venue :- ISST, Saathi centre
Topic :- House keeping
Material :- Mop, duster, dust-pan, mixer grinder, iron,

The topic was housekeeping. Resource person asked some questions to participants' one by one like:

1. How do they use duster?
2. From where do they start cleaning of a house?
3. How do they use mop?

After that resource person discussed every topic one by one like:

1. We should start cleaning form kitchen.
2. We can use a duster maximum sixteen times by changing the sides.
3. We should start mopping from the boundary of a wall.
4. We should use gloves, apron, mask etc, during work.
5. How to maintain electric items?
6. Which type of precaution we should clean electronic items like: fan, washing machine, mixer, cooler etc

Woman's Day 8th March-2014

Introduction & Planning:

ISST,Saathi centre celebrates Woman's day every year. Woman's Day is a full day celebration for the domestic workers. ISST, Saathi centre decided to celebrate Woman's Day on 8th March-2013 from 12:00 am to 3:00pm this year. The preparation for Woman's Day started 8-10 days before, various duties and responsibilities were distributed among staff and volunteers (Domestic workers) to make this program successful. Invitation cards were prepared, and distributed to all the guests, Other NGOs Who are working with domestic workers and Domestic workers one week prior. ISST, Saathi Centre organized one week Dance practice workshop for domestic workers' children and theatre workshop for domestic worker.





Strength of participants: 200 Women(approx)

On 8th March, 2014, ISST organized woman's day specially for domestic workers. We invited domestic workers and the NGOs who are working with domestic workers like: - Jagori, Chetnalaya, Sewa Bharat, Delhi Gharelu Shramik Sangthan, AMMT, etc.

The day started with the welcomed of all participants and guests, Coordinator of Saathi Centre addressed the participants and told them the value of woman's day. The programme started with a beautiful Ganesh Vandana presented by the children of domestic workers. After that following programmes were presented during the day

1. Song "Beti hoon main beti" was presented by domestic workers.
2. Play "Halla Bol" was presented by the children of domestic workers.
3. Dance "Dil hai Chhota sa" was presented by the children of domestic workers.
4. Play "Media Ka Kamal" was presented by the children of domestic workers.
5. Play "Nashe se Mukti" was presented by domestic workers.
6. "Fancy Dress" show was presented by domestic workers
7. Song "Jab ban hi gaya bahano ka Sanghtahan" was presented by domestic workers.
8. Two songs presented by domestic workers' of Jagori.

The aim of to organize this vocational training was to empower the youth and provide a skill in their hands, that they can use it in their day to day life, they can earn minimum living. 33 youth of community participated in the workshop. They learnt many things during the workshop like:-

1. Names of tools, used for electrician work.
2. Joint the wire

3. Learn to make an electricity board.
4. Learn to lay an electricity line in the house etc?
5. Precautions to be taken during the repair work.

After 10 days theory, 20 days practical training was provided by the trainer so that they can practice what they had learned in theory.

2. Digital Photography Workshop

The photography workshop started on 23rd February-2014. The ACP and the SHO of Kalyanpuri were invited for the inauguration. The workshop was held from 23rd February-2014 to 16th March-2014 at Saathi centre. The aim of to organize this vocational training was to empower the youth and provide a handy skill to them, which they can use in their day to day life and also develop as a profession. 33 youth of community participated in the workshop. The Exhibition “Jharokha” was inaugurated on last day of exhibition.



1. Theatre and Cultural activities:-

ISST Saathi Centre conducts theatre and cultural activities for the students of Saathi centre twice a week. These activities include songs, dance and theatre. In this series for summer vacations we planned theatre workshop for the children. The workshop was held from 1st June to 20th June 2013. The resource person (Mr. Rohit from National School Of Drama) trained the children for two plays named “Halla Bol” and “Dhinchika Dhinchika”. Total 26 children participated in theatre workshop. Children enjoyed the theatre and presented these plays on 25th June-2013 during summer festival.

The information about the use of RTI to obtain information regarding the progress reports of their respective applications was given by the RTI help desk in the camp.

Different RTI Acts were displayed in the camp with the help of charts. Due to lack of time only few RTI applications could be written. Others were called at Saathi centre to file their applications.

R.T.I. CAMP-2

The camp was organized on 20th June-2013, 10:00am to 2:00pm 17-21, block, Jhuggi clusters, Kalyanpuri Delhi-91.

The aim of the camp was to spread awareness about RTI and write on the spot complains and RTI applications of the people of community for their grievances with Govt.

Around 60 people participated and out of them 36 received the benefits of R.T.I camp (cast certificates-5, ration card-30, income certificate-1) Most of them having cast certificate and ration card related problems. The information about filing complaints and RTI applications was given by the RTI help desk, like:-how and

where can we approach to get information regarding ration cards, birth and cast certificates, ladali, income certificates, voter cards etc. from govt. departments.

Different RTI Acts were displayed in the camp with the help of charts. Due to lack of time only some RTI applications could be written on the spot. Others were advised to contact Saathi centre to file their applications and learn more about the law.

Our target group was between ages of 16- 20 yrs.

R.T.I. WORKSHOP-3

The workshop was held on 19th and 20th November -2013 from 10:00am to 4:00pm at Ashadeep foundation GRC, 18, block Kalyanpuri with the aim to spread awareness about RTI, to train the youth of community with the tool of RTI and prepare a pressure group. Our target group was between ages of 16-25yrs.

Strength of participants: 32

The resource person discussed about different acts of RTI in detail, how to write RTI and the fee of RTI application, resources person also told the participants that there is no fee for BPL and AAY card holders. We must get information in stipulated time.

We can file an appeal if we don't get:-

1. Correct information
2. Information in stipulated time
3. Information, as defined in the act.
4. Satisfactory information etc.
5. What to do if we get information after stipulated time
6. When should we go for 1st appeal.
7. Who is first appeal authority?
8. When should we apply to the 2nd appellate authority.
9. We can file 2nd appeal within 90 days etc.

Successful stories and experiences regarding RTI were shared by the resource person.

Before closing the day there was a round of questions/answers in which participants were given opportunities to clear their various doubts.

R.T.I. WORKSHOP-4

A two days RTI workshop was held on 14th and 15th February -2014 from 10:00am to 4:00pm Rasta NGO, Weast Vinod Nagar with the aim to spread awareness about RTI, to train the youth of community with the tool of RTI and prepare a pressure group. Our target group was between ages of 20-35yrs.

TWO DAYS LIFE SKILL WORKSHOP

3RD & 4TH MAY, 2013

After a meeting with the principal of a government boys school (RSBV, school Kondali) and on the request of the principal we decided to organize a life skill workshop for the students of class XII. The principal and teachers of govt. schools often complain about the devaluation of character and morals in the students of these schools. They often show disrespect not only to their teachers but also to their parents and elders.

We decided to take up the issue by approaching the nearby school from where a number of students visit our centre for different facilities and programmes. Most of them were the children of domestic workers, rickshaw pullers, daily laborers, vegetable venders etc.

Strength of Participants: 35

The two days Life Skill workshop was held in the RSBV With the aim to create value in young minds. The request to hold this kind of workshop by the principal of government school Kondali was sent to us. On 3rd and 4th May-2013 we conducted the life skill workshop for them. Necessary arrangements for the venue, materials to be used were made prior to the training. Students and teachers were informed about the workshop.

On day one the program started with introduction round and set the rules for the training. This was followed by an exercise of meditation to calm the minds of the restless students. A song to relax the participants and make them feel part of the group was sung.

The students were introduced to the topic of the training which was-managing emotions like anger.

Students were paired up and asked to find two strengths and weaknesses each of their partners. The students found this exercise to be very interesting and thought provoking. Next the topic of “emotion and managing them” was taken up. With few games and exercise, very subtly the students were made aware of their predominate emotions.

Students, at every stage participated actively and displayed their talents, which they shared that even they didn't know existed within them.

Various types of emotions, ways of expressing emotions, type of anger, anger management were the topics covered. The training was made participatory and discussion enriched every one. Two teachers from the school took keen interest in the activities, and gave their inputs. The curtain was drawn on the first day session, with every participants recognized and accepting various emotions be it of compassion, hatred, love, indifference anger etc. in them and how to balance their emotions to live life more effectively.

On day two the students were already seated in the room and eagerly waited for the program to commence. All the participants, who attended the 1st day, were present.

The proceeding of the first day was recap, in brief. The

The topic of the day “Violence” was introduced by asking all participants to share their experience of the first violent scene they could remember. It was interesting to note that except, most of the participants spoke about disharmony and violence in the streets, bases, or among friends. Not many considered domestic violence and physical punishment at school to be violence through interactive participation, they were made aware of the four types of violence and how it is manifested in our day to day life

Participants were divided in to five groups with seven members in each group to depict various from of violence and what can be done to combat it through role plays .Each groups was given a situation. After fifteen minutes they worked in teams and enacted the situation for the whole groups

It was very challenging for few of the students to take on the roles, white others were natural action they expressed that they had never done these kind of activities and enjoyed them thoroughly this was followed by a discussion to take down the point of how violence different situations in our daily lives can be handled.

The training ended with students requesting to have more of these programs. The teachers and principal also showed been interest to have life-skills workshops on regular basis in their school.

STAFF MEETINGS, STAFF TRAININGS AND SHARING OF EXPERIENCES

Staff Meetings (April-March)

To enhance the effectiveness of any community action, it is very important to share the experiences and learn from each other. The staff of Saathi Centre is never hesitant to take guidance from any possible resource. During these sharing sessions we try to invite volunteers and also representatives from the youth group to jointly assess the programme and address the underlying problems.

Ten sharing meetings were held and the following issues were thoroughly discussed.

1. Providing the identity cards to women's groups and members of Yuva Saathi youth group.
2. How to network with schools to reach out to maximum numbers of children.
3. Networking with other vocational training institutes.
4. Skill development of staff members.
5. Fund raising.
6. Developing appropriate formats for documentation.
7. Important events to be conducted by centre time to time.

Detail:-

As we conducted a paramedical training for the staff and volunteers on 23rd March-2013, in this series a follow-up training was organised as lots of doubts and queries were forthcoming during the paramedical practices performed by the volunteers inside the community. The queries were regarding blood pressure check, precautions to be taken during high fever, how to prepare oral rehydration solution etc. All staff members and volunteers took part in follow –up training. They practiced all that they learnt before and cleared their doubts.

STAFF TRAINING-2

Half day training cum workshop on “Office Management” was organized on 6th August-2013 from 11:00 am to 2:00 pm to ensure that centre runs with optimum level of efficiency which ensures greatest positive result and strength of staff skills, so that the perfect use of human resource and material resource of an organization can be achieved. For the workshop ISST invited mr. Hira Lal Jain, administrator “National Blind Youth Association” (NBAY) as resource person. The resource person was very experienced in the field. He cited many stories on how an strategic approach can make a difference. Minimizing wastage can directly be related to maximizing resources. He explained the importance of reducing, recycling and reusing of resources. He motivated the trainees by citing the example of blind school.

1. How blind children are becoming an idol to all?
2. How did they maintain hostel for blinds without any grant from govt or any other organization?
3. How is NBAY providing a platform to blind children and youth?

4. How good intentions and dedicated work can get translated into collecting funds.

Resource person shared with his own example that how can we manage our organization or office with minimum resources and how can we raise funds from common people. Staff members shared their experiences too.

Resource person discussed the following points during the training:-

1. What is jansunwai or public hearing?
2. What is the purpose to organizing Jansunwai?
3. All government departments can be invited for Jansunwai.
4. We should give invitation letters one month before the event to the different departments.
5. We should also inform police a week prior.

All volunteers put lot of queries understood the meaning of Jansunwai and they were agreed to lend a hand to organise Jansunwai. ISST Saathi Centre decided that jansunwai will be organized in second week of November 2013.

THREE DAYS' CWSN WORKSHOP

and problems and can aware/inform their parents and their school teachers regarding their weaknesses and special abilities of work so that they can do better for the educational development of children.

- Difficulty reproducing numbers and shapes (can't visually recall them)
- Makes errors when copying and slow in copying from the blackboard
- Difficulty following a sequence of events to solve a problem e.g. mathematical problems
- Difficulty remembering a sequence of events correctly
- Difficulty telling a story in the correct sequence

After this exercise resource person divided the participants in to group of four and gave them to prepare worksheets for assessment of different age groups.

Day-2

The day second started with day one review and discussion about worksheet which were prepared day before.

Today resource person covered the following topics during the workshop:-

Administering Auditory Perception Tests

- **While administering Auditory items it is very important to keep in mind that;**
 - There should not be any visual material presented to the child.
 - The child has to listen to do the tasks and he may be given a response sheet to record his responses for the assessor to tally later.
- The reason why no visual input should be presented is that a lot of children are strong visual learners remembering words as a visual image but unable to identify sound units in words.
- This may later become a limitation while they have to learn new words as they do not have the required skills to decode sounds in a word.

Auditory Figure Ground

- The ability to pick out or focus on a particular sound against the background of other sounds.
- For children with Figure-ground processing problems, noises prevent them from understanding much of what is said.
- Some children (and adults too) have particular difficulty in discriminating speech or other sounds in the presence of back ground noises--even small ones. For them noises are more than minor annoyances. They are a major cause of learning disabilities.
- These individuals are constantly switching their attention to unimportant sounds such as foot scraping, light buzzing, whispering, pencils falling, blowing wind and fans etc. etc. etc.
- Hence, they miss most of what they need know, and find listening unrewarding, if not fatiguing.

Examples of ways to assess Auditory Figure-Ground

- Picking out the bird calls among other forest sounds
- Names of the main characters in a listening comprehension.
- Picking out words starting with a particular sound, like all /t/ from a list of words like:

truck,umbrella,mother,time,lollipop,computer,tiger,torch.

Auditory Discrimination

Auditory discrimination is the ability to recognize differences in phonemes (sounds). This includes the ability to identify words and sounds that are similar and those which are different.

Auditory Blending

Auditory blending is the process of putting together phonemes to form words. For example, the individual phonemes "c", "a", and "t" are blended to form the word, "cat".

Blending plays a major role in reading.

If a child has a processing problem in blending, trying to learn to read using the phonics approach can be very frustrating and unrewarding.

Examples of ways to assess Auditory Blending

- Join together 2 words to make one compound word
milk+man= milkman, air+port= airport
- Join together the sounds /c/ /a/ /t/ =cat,
/cl/ /o/ /ck/= clock.
- Join together the sound /h/ and /arm/ what do you get? Answer- 'harm'

Auditory Analysis

The ability to break down a word in its individual sound units.

This is what helps us to spell, when we hear a word, if we can analysis the word in its phonic units only then can we write the spelling.

Examples of ways to assess Auditory Analysis

- How many sounds can you hear in the word 'drum'?
/dr/ /u/ /m/
- Say the word 'found' now say it again removing /f/ and putting /r/ what do you get? Answer round.

Auditory Closure

The ability to hear part of a word ,a rhyme or a song and say the whole.

Useful in giving verbal prompts to children to help recall something they have learnt.

Examples of ways to assess Auditory Closure

- How many words can you make with the beginning sound /b/ - black, block, blot, blink.
- How many words can you make with the ending sound /and/- hand ,sand ,stand ,land ,grand ,bland ,brand
- Finishing proverbs: Old is..... , Health is..... ,Laughter is the best.....

Auditory memory

Auditory memory is the ability to store and recall information which was given verbally.

An individual with difficulties in this area may not be able to follow instructions given verbally or may have trouble recalling information from a story read aloud.

Auditory memory can be sequential or non-sequential.

Examples of ways to assess Auditory Memory Sequentially

- Being able to say the whole alphabet and numbers in order.
- Play memory games like ‘I went to the market to buy...’
- Listening to a story and remembering the sequence of events when retelling it.
- Digit span: Listen to these numbers and repeat in reverse sequence:
2....5....7

Examples of ways to assess Auditory Memory Non-Sequentially

- I am going on a holiday to the beach I packed the following items; a swimsuit, pair of rubber slippers, my sunglasses, sunscreen,3 T-shirts and shorts.

The child will be expected to remember as many items as possible in any random order.

Day-3

3rd started with recall day 2nd exercise. The resource person discussed the following points during the day:-

Language Assessment

- Receptive language
- Listening
- Reading
- Expressive language
- Oral
- Written

Receptive language activities :

Listening comprehension

Listening and following directions activity

Reading comprehension

Its important to remember that questioning has to be varied with MCQs, word meaning, fill in the blanks etc.

Expressive language activities :

Oral expressive skills based on a picture ,object or a topic.

Written expression could be picture based simple expression on a topic.

Maths Assessment

To check for basic concepts at each level

Pre maths: Tall-short, Big-small, More-less

Before-after-in between numbers.

Place value, Addition, Subtraction, Multiplication, Division, Fractions, Story sums.

Graphomotor skills

The aim here is to check for handwriting, to see if the child has visual perception, memory or motor co-ordination problems.

The child can be asked to write a sentence like:

The quick brown fox jumps over the lazy dog.

- Once in their best handwriting.
- Then in their normal handwriting.

Then as many times in a given time period

Points to remember!

- Create the assessment keeping in mind that the child may be functioning below his /her class level.
- The assessment may have to be conducted over 2-3 sessions of 30-45 minutes each to rule out fatigue.
- Form a rapport with the child before you start for best performance.
- You may clarify queries of the child but no help should be provided to answer.

Make a note of all observable behaviours like attention spans, impulsivity, tendency to give up easily, anxiety

After the lunch resource person told to the participants to make worksheets for the topic discussed today.

After that resource person told to the participants that we should have an assessment format so that we can keep record of the student. Resource person discussed the points which shoul include in assessment format:-

Creating a Format to Record Assessment

- Make a format beginning with listing basic details.
- Include some background information relevant to the assessment.
- Mention areas being assessed and the purpose being aimed at.
- Mention the aim of each item and observations on how the child fared.

- End with an overall summary of how the child fared, mention the positive behaviors observed, and mention classroom/academic/social/organizational implications of the child's deficit areas.

Mention certain accommodations and modifications which can be included to help the children

STAFF TRAINING-6

Training with GRC and Staff

ISST Saathi Centre organized three days teacher training from 10th February to 12th February-2014 with GRC and staff of ISST with the aim of learning Innovative method of teaching (5-12 years), preparing material for innovative learning /teaching, behavior modification and value creation through story telling at Saathi Centre. ISST invited GRC's, other organizations and volunteers for the workshop. Two resource persons from "Katha" conducted the training.

Total participants : 18



Day-1

The day one started with introduction round. Participants sang a song “geet ga rahen hain”. Resource person gave sheets to participants to fill their details and expectations from workshop.

Resource person asked the participants to recall a story which they heard in their childhood from their parents or relatives. They were asked to present the story before the participants and describe why do they remember this story? Participants presented their story in front of the participants.

After that resource person described that during the story telling we play many acts like hand movements, talking act, body language, facial expressions etc., after that resource person gave a sentence to the participants and asked them to express the various emotions using the same sentence.

Resource person then divided the participants in three groups of and asked them to collect five waste things from the trash outside. After collecting waste resource person distributed the waste among the groups and told them to make a story with it.

Resource person told to the participants that we should keep some necessary things in our mind like:

- Topic of the story
- Subject of the story like: - horror, comedy, imaginary etc.
- Characters
- Things etc.

After that participants made picture stories and presented it before the participants.

The session ended with lots of discussions regarding this activity.

Day-2

The second day started with review of day one Resource person talked about integrated learning. Resource person told that a story gather all subjects in itself like science, math, language, social science it called integrated.

Resource person divided the participants in three groups and told them to write story which they prepare day before and seek subjects which are used in the story.

Participants prepared the same and presented one by one.

After that resource person gave an activity sheets to the participants based on behavior patterns of children like: shiny child, over excited child, child with special needs etc. and asked the participants to take signatures on the sheet. and make a bingo. Based on this activity following points were discussed in detail.

- How will you treat these types of children?
- How will you teach them?
- How will you help the child?

The session ended with the discussion.

Day-3

The day three started with the review of day two. Resource person divided the participants into three groups and gave them some sheets to make teaching learning material based on stories which were prepared by the participants like: Finger puppets, danglers, story cards, puzzles, story charts etc.

All participants made the TLM (teaching/learning material) and presented during the training.

Now the ISST has some handmade TLM for children of Bachpan.

STAFF TRAINING-7

3rd March-2014 to 7th March-2014

ISST, Saathi Centre organized 5 days training on IQ testing, use of innovative method of teaching, psychometric assessment, techniques of counseling etc. to upgrade the teaching skills of staff.

Topic: - The training was on use of innovative methods to teach children and reorientation of the educators upgrade the services of the centre.

Date: - 3rd March-2014

Time: - 12:00pm to 2:00pm

Venue: - ISST, Saathi Centre, Police Station Kalyanpuri

Day-1

The training was on use of innovative methods to teach children and reorientation of the educators upgrade the services of the centre.

The Saathi Centre has been running successfully educational programs for young children and girls and boys (aged 14-21 yrs.).

A need has been felt to upgrade the existing strategies and resources to enhance the services given.

The focus of the training was on use of innovative methods to teach children of all age groups. Saathi centre has been running two educational programs for children and youth successfully. The focus of the training was to reinvent the existing programs to make them more educative and interesting. Along with play way methods, techniques like using colorful charts, display of sight words, individualized work-sheets for all age level were discussed and prepared. It was highlighted that continuous training of the educators should be an important component of the program.

Topic: - Effectiveness of psychometric assessment in wholesome development of children.

Date: - 4th March-2014

Time: - 12:00pm to 2:00pm

Venue:- ISST, Saathi Centre, Police Station Kalyanpuri

Day-2

The meeting began with everyone sharing the parameters they consider to assess a child's development. Few members came up with wonderful antidotes of how working on the emotional, social and physical aspects of a child helped them to develop in to a healthy being.

The concept of "Wholesome development" of a child, the role of biological, social, environmental and emotional factors aiding to personality development of the child were discussed. Basic concept of intelligence, emotional quotient and the importance of IQ tests in an educational system were explained in simple terms.

The use of psychological tests, along, with educational assessment can help when the children are assessed and classified on the basis of their IQ and EQ, the teachers who are the prime educators should also have the knowledge of the classification. Each child is helped to ensure optimum level. So that the program for the children could be designed in a fashion that brings out their potential to the optimum level.

Topic: - follow up

Date:- 5th March-2014

Time:- 12:00pm to 2:00pm

Venue:- ISST, Saathi Centre, Police Station Kalyanpuri

Day-3

A follow up of the previous day training was done to discuss the utility of the tests done on the children.

For practical experience Bhatia Battery Test was done by the participants to understand the setting and how the test is conducted.

Topic: - Techniques of counseling

Date:- 6th March-2014

Time:- 12:00pm to 2:00pm

Venue:- ISST, Saathi Centre, Police Station Kalyanpuri

Day-4

The training started with all the participants sharing their views on counseling. General understanding was that the counseling is giving advice, helping others to find solution of their problems etc. The resource person explained the actual meaning of counseling, the process involved in counseling and the various techniques used in giving counseling. The skills require by the counselor to enable the subject to utilize his/her potential to adapt to their environment or find solution to their problem were also taken up.

The misconception and myths regarding the process of counseling were also clarified. Many interesting questions were put up by the participants. The qualities of a good counselor like honesty, empathy, non-judgmental attitude etc. were discussed at the length. The session ended with a small role play and everyone clarifying their doubts. It was more of interactive session where participants could understand the nuance of counseling.

Day-5

CAREER COUNSELING WORKSHOP:-

To empower the youth to take informed decision about their future course of action, a career counseling session was organized. They were asked to come prepared with their concerns and questions.

On the day of the program, a sheet of questions to have a fair idea about the background of the participants was given. Most of the questions were on vocational programs available after completing the XIth class. They were told about the Delhi university programs, professional courses, Options in defense services, and many other competitive exams available for state level govt. services. Many of the participants were keen to know about job market after passing out school. A detailed information was given to them on the employable skills required to enter the job market and encouraged to work hard to enhance their abilities at every possible opportunity they get. Many of the participants wanted to know more about specific courses, for which it was agreed upon separate sessions for them later.

STAFF TRAINING-9

30th March-2014

ISST Saathi Centre organized a full day workshop on **Training Skills, communication skills, body language and hand writing analysis, with the aim** to introduce different training skills used in development training programs, to acquaint with the skill of analyzing hand writing of a person in behavioral terms, to develop understanding regarding body language, to develop communication skill. It will help the working staff to acquire skill of using important training skills like group discussion, information presentation, conduct interactive talks and run a participatory training program, understand behavior and personality of the individual while analyzing handwriting and signature of the individual, understand behavior from body language of an individual, understand process of communication and improve communication skills especially spoken skills, on 30th March-2014 from 9:30am to 5:00pm at Indian Hypnosis Academy, A-1/116, Sector 7, Rohini, Delhi-11008

Proceeding of the day:-

The day started with introduction round. Resource person introduced the topics of workshop.

Resource person discussed that the human mind is an active actor behind behavior of an individual in a particular situation. Hand writing of a person is connected with the subconscious mind of the person; an individual can be understood easily while looking at the handwriting of the person. Similarly signature of an individual reflects one's self image. Knowledge of handwriting analysis (graphology) is of immense importance for an individual.

Communication of an individual involves both verbal and non verbal communication. Individuals communicate with their entire body, i.e., different gestures, postures and movements convey useful information. Knowledge of body language enables a person to bridge gap of verbal communication held with other people.

The second important work done by the social worker is of change agents using their capacity building skills, i.e., training skills. A social worker trained in training skills and well acquainted with graphology and body language can serve the people more effectively with minimum efforts and maximum results.

The entire workshop was conducted on participatory basis in an environment of friendly warmth and acceptance.

Following techniques were used in the workshop:

- Orientation of the topic
- Group and individual exercises
- Debriefing
- Practice exercises

What We Learned
