Introduction

The Institute of Social Studies Trust (ISST), a non-profit organization, was registered as a trust in 1980. ISST's overall aim is research for change with focus on work and well-being of the vulnerable communities from gender perspective. It attempts to bridge the gaps between research, action and policy.

Headquartered at India habitat centre in New Delhi and a community outreach programme Kalyanpuri Police Station, East Delhi. In recognition of its contribution, ISST has been conferred NGO Consultative Status (Special) by the United Nation. ISST has a FCRA number and account in Delhi.

The ISST community centre was initiated in 2000 in three slum communities in the Trans Yamuna region: West Vinod Nagar resettlement colony, Sonia camp and Nehru camp working initially with child education and development. This work was expanded to include a more holistic engagement with community development, including in particular a focus on youth groups. In June 2006, a new centre, SAATHI Centre, was begun at the Kalyanpuri Police Station in East Delhi, which is now the main field office for the community work. This centre was started to continue the work of the organisation with the community focusing on young children and youth groups, but also to facilitate the use of RTI by the marginalised communities of the region.

Kalyanpuri and its surrounding areas like Trilokpuri, Khichripur, Mandawali (slums and resettlement colonies), in East Delhi, are areas with a very high incidence of crime and drug abuse, besides other problems faced by any urban slum in Delhi. Women here are mostly engaged in domestic work and in home based work (embroidery, jewellery making) and men work as informal sector workers such as rickshaw pullers, factory workers, fruits and vegetable vendors, petty retailers or construction labour. For children and youth in these households, there are limited opportunities for anything beyond very minimal care or education, and risks posed by the surroundings. These include drug dealers and drug abuse, gambling and frequent outbreaks of violence, and fear of sexual violence for girls. While many children are enrolled in school, there is a high dropout rate and some non-enrolment. In many cases, it is found that many girls either never enrol in schools or drop out after 5th standard in order to take over child care responsibilities for younger siblings and household chores as both their parents have to work to make ends meet. Boys drop out and get involved in petty crimes.

ISST Saathi Centre has been working on community development and empowerment through its outreach programme with women, young children, adolescent boys and girls and young adults. Overall, ISST's community outreach programme seeks to engage with individuals and communities through holistic education, awareness-raising, and skill-building activities in order to enable individuals to better understand their environments, make the best possible decisions

for the use of their resources and enhance quality of life for themselves, their families and their communities.

The work with the community at the Saathi centre has over the years, largely focused on four strands: Right to Information and community development, the Bachpan programme, a Youth Resource Centre and Domestic Workers programme.

The community centre is seeking funds to continue its important and needs based work on community development and empowerment and to expand some of its essential activities.

A. NFI supported activities

B. ISST, Supported activities:

Youth Resource Centre:

The Youth Resource Centre is an essential component of the community outreach programme of ISST's Saathi Centre. It has been a key feature of the outreach programme which has the primary objective of enhancing the employability and life chances of young people in Kalyanpuri and the neighbouring areas. This is done through enhancing and supplementing their education through computer literacy programmes and functional English courses to strengthen their communication skills. Periodic vocational training programmes on trades such as mobile repairing, carpentry, tailoring, pottery and crafts, tailoring and dress designing, electrician training, plumbing etc is also provided for young adults. Many of our students, over the years, post the skill development and educational enhancement and life skills training, have gotten employment.

Daily activities: - ISST, Saathi Centre is running a six month computer and English Conversation integrated course. Presently there are 100 students taking training of computer and English.

Other activities: - ISST, Saathi Centre conducted monthly discussion meeting, RTI, life skill and gender sensitization workshop respectively on 26th Sep-2014, 24th and 25th November-2014 for the youth of community and Saathi Centre.

The organization provides a certificate and 100% job placement to the trainers in related areas.

Details:-

Today a group discussion organized for the youth of Saathi Centre. The topic of the discussion was leadership. The aim of to select this topic was to recognize/understand the values of leadership. Following points were discussed during discussion:-

1. What are the characteristics of a good leader?
2. What are the qualities of a leader?
3. Which type of etiquette should be in a leader?
4. A leader should not be selfish.
5. Leader must not discriminate.
6. A leader should be polite.
7. There should be endurance in a leader.

Youth made the discussion very successful with sharing their views.

Subject :- **Discussion group meeting (team management)**
Meeting Date :- **29/11/2014**
Attendees :- **58**

The topic of the discussion was team management. The aim to select this topic was to understand value of team work. Resource person told the participants what is management, exactly? And how does it differ from leadership? "**Leaders are people who do the right things; managers are people who do things right.**" Following points were discussed during discussion:-

1. How can a leader keep harmony in team?
2. What qualities a good team should have?
3. How does a leader allocate/distribute work and duties between the team members?
4. What type of challenges can be faced by a team?
5. Team should be kept motivated by the leader.
6. Leader must not discriminate.
7. A leader should take feedback from his team.
8. Good communication is essential for team management.

Youth made the discussion very successful with sharing their views.

R.T.I. WORKSHOP:

The workshop was held on 26th September -2014 from 10:00am to 5:00pm at ISST, Saathi Centre Police Station Klyanpuri with the aim to spread awareness about RTI, to train the youth of community with the tool of RTI and prepare a pressure group. Our target group was between ages of 16-25yrs.

Strength of participants: 40

The resource person discussed about different acts of RTI in detail, how to write RTI and the fee of RTI application, resources person also told the participants that there is no fee for BPL and AAY card holders. We must get information in stipulated time.

We can file an appeal if we don't get:-

1. Correct information
2. Information in stipulated time
3. Information, as defined in the act.
4. Satisfactory information etc.
5. What to do if we get information after stipulated time
6. When should we go for 1st appeal.
7. Who is first appeal authority?
8. When should we apply to the 2nd appellate authority.
9. We can file 2nd appeal within 90 days etc.

Successful stories and experiences regarding RTI were shared by the resource person.

Before closing the day there was a round of questions/answers in which participants were given opportunities to clear their various doubts.



Life Skill and gender sensitization Workshops:

Date :- 24th and 25th November , 2014

Venue :- Saathi Centre, Kalyanpuri Police Station

Number of Participants :- 35

Day one session started with an introduction round. The activity named “Mera Aaina Meri Tasveer” was used as an icebreaking activity. The aim of the activity was to understand oneself better and in true colour.

A fun game “Kana Phusi” was played to evaluate the concentration level while listening and giving away message to others.

The session was based on to inculcate listening skills and also to understand the difference between reacting and responding. A game “Follow me” was played to make the participants understand different emotions like anger, fear, disgust, joy etc.

Managing the anger is extremely crucial to the young generation. The following points were discussed.

1. What is anger?
2. Understanding anger and its genesis.
3. What are the causes and impact of anger?
4. How can we understand the causes of our anger?
5. Importance of understanding the causes.
6. Calming yourself and others during anger.
7. Managing anger with positive attitude.
8. Channelizing anger towards right direction.

Day 2nd session started with the review of day one, participants told many things and activities which were held on day one. After that a warm-up exercise had done to make active the participants.

Thereafter resource person asked to the participants that “What is Gender”?

Some of them told that difference between male and female by nature is called Gender. So resource person define the correct definition of Gender to participants. That was a fruitful discussion happened.

There was break for tea.

After the discussion resource person gave next activity and divided the participants in to group of five. They had to write about the differences of girl and boys in the way of work and responsibilities and changed the behavior according to their age.

Participants wrote in a nice way and presented it before the other participants.

After that resource person asked some questions from participants like:-“why the need of woman/girl reservation did arose? Why do our govt. keep seats reserve for woman/girl in buses, metro, trains etc? Everybody has their own answer few correct and few incorrect. Resource person told the correct need of reservation and discussed about the same.

In the end of the session resource person told all the participants that anyone whether male or female should help to each other and should give respect to them and their views.

RTI Help Desk: - ISST, Saathi Centre run a RTI help Desk to sort out the problems of community regarding Govt. and other departments. Approx 100 applications are written and filled by Saathi Centre on monthly basis.

Bachpan Program:

The Bachpan programme of the community outreach programme is targeted at young children of Kalyanpuri and the surrounding areas and involves offering educational support services to young children including facilitating the re-entry of drop outs (both boys and girls) to school as well as the use of an innovative approach to education targeting young children with special needs. This programme also involves child and parent counseling to deal with psychological, emotional health and child development issues. ISST, Saathi Centre organizes monthly Balmanch for the young children / students of Saathi Centre.

Daily activites:

NFE and remedial classes are running for the younger children of community. 200 students registered under the Bachpan program.

Other monthly activities

Theatre and cultural activities:

Children of Saathi centre regularly practice and get trained in theatre and dance. They performed on various occasions in various places. Recently they took part in a festival “EXUBERANCE” 2014 organised by ROTARY international. They won second prize in dance competition.

Under the Community develop program two pressure groups of women and one pressure group of youth which is called YUVA SAATHI MANCH have been formed and actively working for the benefit of community. One literacy class for women is running inside the community of Kalyanpuri in block 18 for the past one year. Besides our workers regularly visit all surrounding communities and spread awareness regarding govt. schemes, school admissions, health and legal awareness etc.
